On the one hand, we assisted some who are highly educated but face English language barriers to navigating the healthcare system and other community resources. This is a group that needs more attention and will request more years of assistance until they get to the level where they can independently navigate healthcare and other community resources.


We appreciate your trust in us and your continued commitment to our mission. We continue to work with you and build a world where all people have access to healthcare without disparities.



Revenue By Customer Summary January 1st - October 26, 2023





Checklists & Pathways

Ebenezer Healthcare Access (EHA) is a bridge that connects underserved communities specifically immigrants in the Dayton and Cincinnati, OH area to healthcare. Language barriers, cultural differences and illiteracy are the core issues surrounding the immigrant community. It is for this reason that Community Health Workers (CHWs) at EHA have made it their mission to assist immigrants to navigate life in the United States through different pathways which are services and the guidance meet this community needs. Before pathways are completed, CHWs meet with the families at their homes, at the EHA offices or any other convenient location at least once a month to evaluate the health of the family, their needs, and their living condition. Checklists forms are used as guidance to CHWs to ask important questions during the home or office visits and these questionnaires are designed based on the age category and pregnancy status. Therefore, we have checklist questions specific to pediatric, adult, or pregnant mothers. In 2023, a total of 8,699 checklists were completed. After a checklist is completed and a client's needs are identified, a CHW works with the client to address those needs through different pathways.





CARE COORDINATION SERVICES

Social Service Referrals & Completed Pathways

A. Connection of Immigrants to Primary Care Providers

During the 2023 year, our multilingual CHWs were able to connect our clients to their PCPs. 187 clients have been connected to PCPs which will reduce the emergency room visits, and readmission rate and promote preventative care within the refugee immigrant population.

B. Connection to Specialists

During the 2023 year, our multilingual CHWs were able to connect our clients to 250 specialists. This includes eye doctors, GI doctors, dentists, dermatologists...

C. Connection to Health Insurance


Many immigrants did not have access to health care because of a lack of Health insurance. CHW is connected to 124 clients to Health insurance.

D. Education Pathways

Education and social service referrals dominate the table of pathways completed which is not surprising considering the financial and sociocultural characteristics of the population we serve. Most of the clients we serve

are immigrants and refugees who came to the United States with little to no knowledge of the American culture, language, and other skills needed for the integration into the community. A small portion of the population we serve comes with a strong educational background but needs assistancewith basic needs as they settle and integrate themselves to a new country where theirdegrees earned outside the US might not be recognized on the job market.Through 9497 education pathways, clients were educated on different health topics related to preventive medicine, primary care and adherence, reproductive health, childand maternal health,

mental health, etc.





E. Social service Referrals Pathways

It is without surprise then that of 5,350 social service referrals made in 2023, translation assistance was 3670 (67%). Other common social services referral pathways included food assistance (405), assistance with transportation (233), diapers (244), Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)(76), health insurance (96), and assistance with clothing and other baby items (73). Other services provided included family assistance, assistance with utilities, education and clothing, legal assistance, cribs, car seats, school supplies, furniture, housing, employment, and financial

In 2023, we had 729 clients who were eligible to get COVID-19 vaccine, but only 17.8% (130 clients) were vaccinated while the remaining 82.1% (599 clients)were not vaccinated yet. This a good indicator of how much education on COVID-19 vaccines is still needed in the communities we serve.

Meet Ruvamwabo Mukesha:

Ruvamwabo Mukesha is a 50-year-old refugee and a single mum of four children from a refugee camp in Uganda where she spent 20 years before moving to the US Baltimore where she spent 5 years. When she moved to Dayton, OH from Baltimore, she had numerous needs including, Health insurance, getting food, connecting kids to schools, employment, and having means to pay for utilities. Ebenezer Healthcare Access CHWs (Community Health Workers) have relentlessly helped her to get Health insurance and connect her and her all-family members to Primary Care providers.

Ruvamwabo has a language barrier, she doesn't speak, write, or read English therefore she is in constant need of an interpreter. CHW assisted her in performing plenty of interviews with Job and Family Services to get benefits such as food, and medical assistance. In addition, CHW assisted her 4 kids to enroll in school. Before becoming Ebenezer's Client, Ruvamwabo had a three-month past due utility bill of \$718.23 and a disconnection notice, CHW connected her to Community Action and assisted her in applying and getting approved to be on the PIPP program which has paid in full this utility bill.

Ruvamwabo stated that "I am so grateful for Ebenezer Services, I do not know how I should survive in this country without a company like Ebenezer which is helping to get what I need and advocate for me when I am not able to express myself in English".
